Coronavirus Regulations (Summary)

• FROM FRIDAY 27TH NOVEMBER CHURCHES WILL BE CLOSED FOR TWO WEEKS UNTIL FRIDAY 11TH. MASS WILL BE CELEBRATED IN PRIVATE (EXCEPT WEDDINGS & FUNERALS OF 25 PERSONS) AND BROADCAST LIVE ON FACEBOOK.

The Diocese received clarification from the Executive Office relating to queries raised by Churches and faith communities in relation to the two-week period of lockdown. The key points are:

•Baptisms may NOT take place during the two week period of lockdown. •A maximum of EIGHT persons can be in the Church while a live broadcast is taking place.

•A live broadcast MAY NOT take place at the same time as the Church is open for private prayer.

•Churches and Parish Halls/Centres may continue to provide essential services such as food banks and contact centres and may also be open to allow drop-off of charitable donations. (All such activities are subject to social distancing and infection prevention measures and guidance.)

•For 'Drive-in' services, only one household is permitted per car and no one should leave the car except in an emergency.

Christmas 2020 (For your information) will be a very different Christmas for everyone. Families and parishes across the diocese will not be able to celebrate in the normal way. The season of Christmas is a season of celebration, but this year it is essential that we celebrate safely. Normally at Christmas time large numbers of people wish to attend Mass. This year, however, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our churches simply cannot accommodate such crowds if we are to ensure the health and safety of all and conform to Public Health Agency guidance and NI Executive legislation.

It is our hope/intention to have Christmas Masses that are open to the public, but only for as many as the church can legally accommodate. **Our parish church has a maximum capacity of (95)*** which includes front porch, (and Choir gallery overflow - not accessible by disabled). Some parishes will have public masses and private (broadcast) masses. Here at St Anthony's we are still considering the schedule.

In order to avoid the real possibility of increased transmission of the Covid-19 virus this Christmas, it is important to remember;

- 1. The obligation to attend Mass in person this Christmas has been suspended.
- 2. Christmas Masses will be broadcast live and available online, so people are encouraged to participate in a live-streamed Mass.
- 3. People could also choose to attend Mass on one day over the Christmas season up to the Solemnity of the Epiphany, January 6th.

In this extraordinary year, let us all celebrate Christmas safely.
