### Safety Arrangements during the COVID-19 Health Emergency with the Resumption of Public Worship in the Churches

The pope invites Catholics and Marian Shrines around the world to dedicate the month of May to a marathon of prayer for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic. Catholics across the globe are encouraged to dedicate the Marian month of May to praying for an end to the pandemic. The initiative, behind which the Pope has thrown his support, involves 30 Marian Shrines from various parts of the world. The Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization announced the news with a press release on Wednesday afternoon. It takes place under the theme "The whole Church was fervently praying to God," which recalls a verse in the Book of Acts (12:5). See Booklet in the porch for details. Each day will see Vatican News broadcast the recitation of the Rosary at 6pm Rome time from the various Shrines taking part in the initiative.
